## **CAP Coordinator**

#### Responsibilities

- Provide individual on-the-job coaching of Community Facilitators to ensure each Client has an up-to-date meaningful and motivating Collaborative Action Plan (CAP).
- Ability to develop necessary CAP Goal "Aids" for successful achievement of Client CAP goal steps.
- Update, revise Goal "Aids" as necessary to assist Client to achieve personal CAP goals.
- To provide a liaison between a Client and their CAP Partners.
- Ability to maintain Client records to ensure accurate and up-to-date health information and Goal Aids.
- Assist Clients to make liasons or connections within the community where appropriate.
- Ensure that relevant information is available for a Client by identifying information collection needs, following-up on information collection by specified Partners as planned, objectively summarizing goal-related information for Clients (e.g., number of times, types of occurrences, length of time, etc.) on a regular basis.

#### **Qualifications:**

- Two year post-secondary degree or diploma in a related human services discipline is required.
- Experience working with persons who have acquired brain injury, including those with complex health, addiction and mental health issues.
